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1. Welcome & Call to Order 6:01 PM
 1. Ashley Byrne, Kate Bassett, Stephanie Behne, Lilli Klein, Kelsey Martin, Allison Connelly, Jinny Piskel, Lindsey Newton, Erin Conley, Mia Ernst, Kenly Mitchell, and others
2. Review/Approve February Meeting Minutes — APPROVED
3. Principal's Report — Erin Conley
 1. There's been a concern regarding specialists and their bathroom privileges — students are able to use the bathroom, but specialists do have limited time with students. Some kids are less likely to push the issue, but teachers are working to make that a dialogue.
 2. Field Trips — several grade levels have been to Mobius, 5th grade to SFCC, 6th grade to the MAC, 5th grade to World Relief and Feast World Kitchen with a speaker. Upcoming field trips: some grade levels will release baby trout, 4th grade to EWU, 2nd-3rd to Mary Poppins, possible planetarium visit.
 3. Planning for last full week of school — 5th and 6th grade promotions, field day, memory book signing day for 6th grade — putting dates on the calendar, having a planning meeting on Monday.
 4. Communication — more open windows into seeing what happens at Roosevelt each day. Social media presence thanks to Ms. Mitchell.
 5. Extracurricular activities: Lego Club, cross country, choir club, art club, English club, homework club, Girls on the Run, Leadership club, Math is Cool, soccer club possibility
 1. Request from Ms. Mitchell — funding for snacks for after school clubs — APPROVED \$150 for reimbursement for snacks
 2. Idea to have a snack drive quarterly to provide snacks for clubs — we will try this
 6. Jinny asked about a concern she has heard about inappropriate language and behavior at recess
 1. Mrs. Conley discussed the layers of support they are providing for 6th grade in particular, which includes some students have alternative recess options available to them. When they are aware of specific concerns, they are better able to address the issues.
 2. Jinny also asked who is responsible for the field maintenance, as there are giant mud puddles — this is a district issue to deal with drainage, and the school is aware of the issues.

2. Funds Requests
 1. Lutton & Erwin (5th) would like \$200 to buy \$10 gift cards to Auntie’s as incentives for Lexia awards — APPROVED
 2. 4th grade request for \$600 for Camp Na-Bor-Lee on Lake Roosevelt for an extended day field trip — APPROVED
 3. ELD — Mia Ernst requested \$200-\$400 for a Mindfulness and Movement program through a yoga teacher in the community. Would like to start with a small group of 6th graders, next year would likely work with 5th graders. First 4 sessions would invite 11-12 girls; if any not available to participate would extend to others. She also applied for a

grant but will not find out until April or May, so looking for starter funds — APPROVED \$400 for 6th grade

4. Ms. Mitchell requested a line item for PTG to fund a cross country coach — \$700-\$800 per season. This school year we had so many kids participate that they had to use as many coaches as were allowed (5 paid), which ate into the rest of the extracurricular budget. Active4Youth allocates a certain amount of money for each school for a 1 to 30 ratio, but they don't always know how many students will sign up per school — APPROVED to be added to next year's budget. We will work on adding clubs and funding for clubs for next year.
